

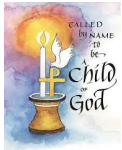

Holy Communion to the Sick - by special ministers who are asked !

“Every encouragement should be given for Holy Communion to be taken from Sunday Mass to those parishioners who are sick or housebound. It is a clear and simple way of indicating that although presently unable to be part of Sunday Mass, the Sunday congregation is praying for them and anxious to care for them”.

The liturgy has given us examples as to how this should be done. The special ministers place their pyx on the Altar before Mass, then, after Holy Communion has been distributed and before the concluding prayer the ministers are called forward to receive a blessing and prayer for the sick. They then leave the church at that moment and go straight to the sick or infirm and proceed with the rite of Holy Communion. This practice will be implemented from January 2025 in our parish.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in you we contemplate the splendour of true love, to you we turn with trust. Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too may be places of communion & prayer
